

ADMISSION GUIDELINES

Students are admitted to the college on the basis of merit and an interview conducted by the Admission committee. Candidates must present themselves for the interview at the time of admission. Candidates who do not appear for the interview will not be considered for the admission. The candidates must produce all the relevant certificates in original for the verification at the time of interview failing which they will not be considered for admission. The college reserves the right to refuse admission to any student without assigning any reason.

The Students seeking admission on the basis of having passed their lower examination from Board/University other than Panjab University are advised to submit their original Migration Certificate and marks sheet at the time of admission. Marks would be verified from the Result Gazette. For admission, fraction of marks less than the requisite percentage would not be rounded off to the advantage of the candidate i.e. 32.9%, 39.9% and 49.9% shall not be rounded off to 33%, 40%, 50% etc. The college will not be responsible if the university does not approve of the admission of a candidate who has made some wrong or incomplete statements, hidden some necessary facts, or attached false or incomplete documents. All admissions made are subject to approval of the Panjab University, Chandigarh and according to eligibility criteria laid down by it.

HOW TO APPLY : Applications on the prescribed form appended to the Prospects should be submitted to the college office as per admission schedule. The form should be complete in all respects, with all supporting documents at the time of submission / interview. Separate Application Forms need to be filled for applying to more than one programme / course / stream.

RESERVATIONS OF SEATS :

- (I) The reservation of seats shall be governed by the Regulation 29.1 and 29.2 given at page 168 in P.U. Cal. Volume-I, 2007 and any intimation by D.R. (Colleges).
However, it is clarified that the concession is not available in the case of candidates who are seeking admission to the next higher class on the basis of having earned compartment in +2 Examination, i.e. in the subject of the compartment.

(b). The free education to the completely blind student belonging to below poverty line, as described by the relevant Government notification/s, in any course in the University and its affiliated Colleges, subject to the students being otherwise eligible and on merit, but the candidate has to submit an affidavit to this effect issued by the competent authority. Even the free hostel accommodation may also be considered, if required by the students, but he will have to pay the mess charges, which are already subsidized. A limited number of course books (one per paper) may also be considered which would be returned after the completion of the course. **(Syndicate Para-1 dated 18-04-2009).**

V. Free education to children of persons killed in November, 1984 riots and terrorist violence in Punjab State **{Approved vide Syndicate para 5 (Statement A) dated 25-04-1987}.**

Two additional seats are created for those girl children for admission to a given course provided they are otherwise eligible from all angles. The additional seats will be only for those girl children who are either a single girl child of her parents or one amongst the only two girl children with no male child. An affidavit (the format of the affidavit is available with the college office) on a stamp paper worth Rs. 20/- duly attested by 1st Class Magistrate to be obtained from the parents of the girl children declaring therein that the benefit of this scheme is being claimed for only one girl child out of two. One additional seat for each student suffering from Cancer, AIDS and Thalassemia has been allowed. It is subject to the condition that the candidate seeking admission under each of these categories is otherwise eligible from all angles.

LATE ADMISSIONS (Subject to the availability of seats) :

A student whose result of 10+2 examination in February/ March conducted by a School Board is published late, but not later than 14th August of the year of admission, may be admitted without late fee within 15 working days of the declaration of the result and his/her attendance shall be counted from the date of admission. This would be applicable to students of Open School Board also. After expiry of this period, the late admission approval from the Vice-Chancellor is required.

In case of Panjab University students who have already appeared in any of its examinations and the result is declared late for one reason or the other, the admission cannot be said to be a case of fresh admission. They are already midway of the course/ class. In their cases, admissions to the next class/ course are allowed within 10 days, from the date of communication of the result, without charging any late fee. Admission is strictly on merit basis.

COMPARTMENT CASES :

A candidate who has been placed under compartment/ reappear in one subject only with at least 20% marks in the subject (theory and practical) in which he/she has been placed in compartment in the +2 examination conducted by the Open School Board in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the 1st semester of B.A. / B.Sc. (General) / B.Com. / B.B.A. / B.C.A. course under 10+2+3 system of education. He/she should have cleared the compartment before the declaration of the first year's result. If he/she is unable to submit the relevant papers/ documents on the date of declaration of result then his/her admission will be automatically cancelled. (With effect from the academic session 2009-2010). (Vide Syndicate Para-16 dated 18-05-2014).

CHANGE OF FACULTY OR SUBJECT

Change of faculty will be allowed by the Principal under exceptional circumstances and that too within one month of the beginning of the session. The student will be required to deposit Rs. 50/- for this. Subject sought by the students will be at their own risk. The change must be intimated to the office and to the teacher concerned. A student cannot change over to the combination that is not provided in the college time table.

The Vice Chancellor has allowed to change a subject in any circumstances in the even semester examination whereas he/she will have to clear that subject as deficient in lower semesters examination which he/she has changed in the higher semester for qualifying the award of Bachelor's Degree. (Vide Circular No. Misc/A-6/3295 Dated 06-04-2018).

RULES FOR WITHDRAWAL :

1. A student who wishes to leave college must apply in writing to the Principal and the application must be countersigned by his/her parents/ guardian.
2. No student will be permitted to leave college until he/she has cleared his/her dues. A student has to pay the college fee and other dues as long as his/her name is not formally withdrawn.

CONDUCT RULES

1. An identity card will be issued to each student by the librarian on production of the original admission fee receipt. Every student shall supply three passport size photographs to the library (two in case of girl students). Students shall carry their identity cards which may be checked by any member of the staff any time during college hours. Loss of identity card should be immediately reported and a fresh one can be obtained on payment of Rs. 50/- and fine of Rs. 10/-
2. **Use of Mobile Phones is Strictly Prohibited.**
3. The college cherishes its tradition of discipline, decorum and hard work. The students are expected to live up to this tradition.
4. The students are expected to show proper regard towards the teachers and behave with gracious politeness with one another. They are expected to be courteous with all other persons who work in the college.
5. Preserving and cultivating the academic atmosphere is vital to the functioning of the college. To this end, it is desirable that the students should maintain silence and order during their movements in the campus. Absolute silence must be maintained in the library.
6. Smoking, chewing tobacco-based products and the use of intoxicants is strictly prohibited and will invite harsh punishment.
7. Walking through the lawns is strictly prohibited.
8. Only Bicycles, Scooters and Motor bikes are permitted.
9. It is the duty of every student to protect the property of the college. Anyone found damaging, or otherwise spoiling it, should be instantly reported to the Principal or any teacher or the Office Staff. Vandalism of any degree will invite deterrent punishment.

ANTI RAGGING RULES

(RAGGING IS TOTALLY BANNED)

"RAGGING" means the following :

Any conduct whether by words spoken or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which cause or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in fresher or a junior student or asking the student to do any act or perform something which such student will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing and generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

PUNISHABLE INGREDIENTS OF RAGGING :

- ◆ Abetment to ragging.
- ◆ Criminal conspiracy to rag.
- ◆ Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging.
- ◆ Public nuisance created during ragging.
- ◆ Violation of decency and morals through ragging.
- ◆ Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt.
- ◆ Wrongful confinement.
- ◆ Use of criminal force.
- ◆ Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences.
- ◆ Extortion.
- ◆ Criminal trespass.
- ◆ Offence against property.
- ◆ Criminal intimidation.
- ◆ Attempts to commit any or all the above mentioned offences against the victim(s).
- ◆ Physical or psychological humiliation.
- ◆ All other offences following from the definition of "Ragging".

PUNISHMENTS (AT THE INSTITUTION LEVEL) :

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offences as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one combination of the following :

- ◆ Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- ◆ Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/ fellowships and other benefits.
- ◆ Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
- ◆ Withholding results.
- ◆ Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament youth festival etc.

HEALTH & HELP-LINE (DHANWANTRI KAKSH)

Ram Ayudh Health Clinic (Extension Service) provides free medical facilities to staff, students and residents of the area. Dr. Naresh Sood, M.B.B.S., D.O.M.S. visits the clinic regularly on **Monday, Wednesday and Friday** between **1:00 to 2:00 pm**. **Free checkup & free medicines are available to the college students, staff and outdoor patients.**

SPORTS

Provisions for a range of sports and games have been made under the supervision of the Director of Physical Education. These include Cricket, Judo, Boxing, Badminton, Table Tennis, Volleyball, Kabaddi, Basketball, Hockey, Athletics, etc. The college wins a number of top positions in sports every year.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

Boys and girls of classes can join the NCC if they have necessary aptitude and physical fitness. Prof. Dimple looks after the NCC in the college. An NCC Cadet is required to attend the annual training camp & other camps organized by Central & State Govt. every year and undergo service training.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The NSS unit of the college has 200 seats for boys and 100 seats for girls. Membership is open to all students. They are required to put in 120 hours of work. This is in the form of participation in the activities of NSS. The best volunteers among the boys and girls are awarded certificates.

SOCIETIES AND CLUBS

For the students' integral development and to promote creativity in them the college has a number of societies and clubs. These include the English Literary Society, Red Ribbon Club, Red Cross Society, History Association, Political Thinkers' Forum, Environment Society, Punjabi Sahit Sabha and Sports Council. Debates, paper-reading and declamation contests, guest lectures, etc. are frequently organized for the benefits of students.

CAREER COUNSELING

In order to enable the students to face the challenges of the competitive world, and make proper choice of career, the college has launched a career guidance cell. Prominent recruitment firms in banking & insurance visit the college for campus placement on regular basis.

YOUTH SERVICE CLUB

The college has a youth service club that functions under the guidance of Department of Youth Welfare, Panjab University, Chandigarh. Boys as well as girls can seek its membership. The club is intended to cultivate the spirit of social service in the students. Its diverse activities include informative discussions and educative hours to places of historical and cultural importance.

COLLEGE PUBLICATIONS

The College Magazine "Shree Panchanan" is edited by a board comprising members of the staff and the students. It has various sections to which the students contribute their articles, stories, poems etc. The college also publishes its half yearly news letter "Sanatan Pratibimb" which carries the activities conducted in the college during every six months. The college has also launched its online journal "The Research Voyage: An International Bi-Annual Peer Reviewed Multidisciplinary Research Journal" with ISSN 2582-6077 in December, 2019. The college releases Prospectus in the first week of June which carries information about various courses available, eligibility criteria, faculty, infrastructure, rule and

regulations for the pupils . Besides, the college will also prepare an Annual Report which will summarize all the academic, extra-curricular, sports, cultural activities and achievements.

GYMNASIUM (MAHAVIR KAKSH) & YOGA

A well equipped sports gym named after Late Sh. Ram Kumar (Bhrigu Shastri) has been constructed to meet the requirements of the college sports-persons & public at charge of nominal fee. The college has Yoga activity area in which Yoga Guru conducts Yoga sessions every morning to strengthen the inner fibre of man.

TELEPHONE FACILITIES

Local telephone facility is available in case of emergency to all regular students of the college.

TUTORIALS

In order to provide opportunity to come in close contact with the lecturers outside the classroom, every student shall be placed in a tutorial group which shall consist of students of all classes under the charge of a lecturer. Group meetings shall be held once a fortnight for debates, speeches, literary discussions etc. The tutor of a group keeps records of all academic and extramural activities of all students in his tutorial group and shall also arrange excursions and outings and hold lectures on ethical and social topics.

HOSTEL AND RECREATIONAL HALL FOR GIRLS

The college provides hostel facilities for girl students. There is a recreational hall for girl students. They can play indoor games in this hall and have their lunch during vacant lectures.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

Here exists an Alumni Association in the College. Students of old batches hold meeting of Alumni Association in the campus and feel a sense of oneness with their Alma Mater.

LABS

The college has well equipped air-conditioned computer labs (with dedicate leased line) along with a Network Resource Centre. In addition to this, there are two bio-technology labs along with separate labs for Physics & Chemistry. There is a facility of Fashion Designing Lab, Psychology Lab for Arts subjects. The college also has a fully equipped Language Lab.

Library, admin office, departments and all PC's in the College premises are Interconncceted in a LAN. Fibre optic Cable is laid to provide high speed internet access. Class rooms are ICT enabled with the facility of Mullti-media projectors and internet access.


